Resolution 288 adopted at the 67th National Convention, calls for placement of the POW/MIA Empty Chair at all official meetings of The American Legion as a physical symbol of the thousands of American POW/MIAs still unaccounted for from WWII, Korean War, Vietnam and other conflicts.
