Chaplain's Corner: Count Your Blessings

It is the first of November and Thanksgiving is just around the bend. It occurs to me that we often do not take the time to remember to be thankful for all that God has provided us. Many of the blessings in our lives seem to be natural blessings and we don't think of them coming from our Creator but the Declaration of Independence declares that "we are endowed by our Creator with certain unalienable rights" and that these may not be taken away from us. It was in 1620 that people seeking to escape the persecution of the Church of England founded, on the shores of what was to become Massachusetts, a colony where they could express their beliefs according to their understanding of the Bible.
